Which Sunglasses

I get asked frequently: Which sunglasses are the best? Sunglasses are essential safety gear. Without sunglasses, you risk getting cataracts, ocular melanoma cancer, or even hitting a reef while boating because of not seeing it due to the sun's glare which polarized UVA/B sunglasses block.



The ABCs of UV sunlight:

- UVA are long wavelength frequencies that are associated with aging because they penetrate deeper into the skin dermis and its elastin fibers. They are also associated with lentigo or aging spots.
- UVB are medium length frequencies that cause sunburns and skin cancers.
- UVC are short wavelength frequencies that are usually absorbed by healthy ozone layer so that not to reach the earth's surfaces. Due to damaging pollution, the ozone layer is thinner which poses greater risk to the planet's inhabitants like us.

Lens material has come a long way from glass to plastic to urethane for durability and scratch resistance. Lens colors range from rose tinting to brown to grey to black as the darkest. Copper color shows the most contrast whereas brown is medium, and yellow/green is better for fog or overcast. VLT is the measured Visible Light Transmission (i.e., Brown 15 means brown lens with 15% of light transmitted and 85% blocked). 10-15% is ideal VLT.

Mirrors reflect light. Black/blue mirrors blacken by an additional 2%, whereas silver/gold darken by an additional 4%. Polarizing lenses block the 90-degree reflected glare of shiny surfaces. To verify if the lenses are polarizing, experiment by taking 2 pairs of sunglasses overlapping the lenses and rotating

them 90 degrees. If they sunglasses are sunglasses should be

darken, then both polarizing. The wrap around so that the

damaging rays can't attack the eyes from the sides as well.

Lastly but equally important are eyeglass holding straps and floating eyeglass cases so you will not cry when you lose your glasses overboard. Duluth Trading sells a very durable floating dual eyeglass case with a built-in lens wipe that holds 2 pairs of eyeglasses. Check it out and have fun.

From the Commodore

Currently when a member purchases an event ticket or renews their membership using PayPal on our website, the club incurs a fee of 3.49%+49 cents. On the \$175 Annual Membership renewal for example, the club will pay PP \$6.60. For the Commodore's Ball last year, the tickets were \$98, so the PP fee was \$3.91.

We are encouraging our members IF POSSIBLE, to pay with a check for events and membership renewals so as to save the club losing that much money. We know that PP is convenient for you and we will continue to make it available to you. We are just asking you to consider paying with a check if you can to help the club.

At our Membership Drive Happy Hour coming up on Saturday February 4, we are incentivizing a check payment for renewal by offering a \$5 entry per person if you pay your renewal with a check. If you pay your renewal with PP, you will pay the normal HH entry of \$10 per person. (During our HH's, we always ask our members to please bring an app to share.)
