


Cooking! On a Boat!

Members Michael and Doris Dix were recently able to attend a cooking demonstration put on for the benefit of the Southern California Yachting Association by SCYA Director Herbert Brown and Kelly Mallaby. Herbert and Kelly are both seasoned (HaHa) boaters and expert chefs, but shared that just following a few simple rules makes it easier to enjoy fine dining while afloat.

Herbert narrated while doubling as sous chef, while Kelly wrung some delightful aromas from a sauce pan. The take-away?

- Consider preservation. Store refrigerated items in the reverse order you will use them to minimize the time your refrigerator door is open, keeping it cooler. When on-board refrigerator / freezers are too small, try using them solely for ice substitutes such as Blue Ice, while keeping perishables in a separate cooler. As the temperature rises in the cooler, swap the warm ice packs with colder ones in your refrigerator. Experiment with canned and dried foods that need no refrigeration.
- Consolidate your Cooking. Fewer burners need not be a problem when you get used to cooking two or more items in the same pan, as Kelly demonstrated using fresh salmon and broccoli.
- 3) Conserve your Fresh Water. Wipe all food from pans, plates and utensils with

paper towels before washing them, which saves lots of rinse water. Sea water can be used for those stubborn items that demand a rinse before washing. Sea water can also be used when cooking bagged, frozen items, as the boiled water never enters the sealed bag.


SGYC:
