



#### **Boating Tips**

The most common items missed on the Coast Guard Vessel Inspection are;

- \*Life preservers must be out of their plastic packaging, unbuckled and ready to be used.
- \*Expired Flares check your expiration dates
- \*Flares need to be unwrapped and ready for use.

Make sure all your life preservers, flares and any additional safety equipment are stowed in an easy to access place in case of emergency. Normally a crisis will not wait for you – Be prepared.


# EVENT HOSTS' BRUNCH
