






Boating Tip—-A dry boat is a happy boat: Moisture and mildew control is a big problem during the winter months when the boats are closed up and the weather is wet. It's a good idea during and after a storm to check for leaks at hatches, ports and seams. Keeping the bilges dry is also important and should be checked frequently. There are inexpensive products such as "Damp Rid" that absorb excess moisture and should be kept in each cabin. They can be bought at hardware and boat stores. It's also a good idea to keep an air dryer in the bilge. West Marine has a plug in that circulates air model #78677518. When the weather clears up, open the boat periodically in order to air it out.

It has 5 separate zip lines that take you from 500 ft to 50 ft elevation, for a total distance of ¾ mile at 300 ft above the canyon floor. You end the tour at Descanso Beach where you may reward yourself with a tall Mai Tai at the beach bar. Price is \$109 (reservations at 800-626-1496). My wife and I have done this and it is a blast.

Another new tour is the "Casino behind the Scene". This historic building is a working theater, ballroom and concert hall. You can experience this historic building during the 70 minute tour by calling 800-626-1496 (\$32 pp).

With the boating season starting up, all you boaters need to start thinking of preparing your boat to be in a ready and safe condition for the season and updating all safety items. I will set up a Vessel Safety Check Inspection offered by the US Coast Guard Auxiliary. Even experienced boaters need a vessel safety check once a year. This 15 minute time could save your life or life of your family member. The Vessel Safety Check is performed on your boat and includes, but is not limited to, checking the life jackets, navigation lights, ventilation, fire extinguishers, distress signals and other items.

SGYC will arrange for this Vessel Safety Check in the next coming months. All interested boaters, please contact me to set up a time and date.


