On May 12th 14 of our members took part in the Safe Boating Course conducted by the US Coast Guard auxiliary at the Seagate Club House. This was an all day activity conducted by 4 different USCG aux. Instructors into boating safety, safety equipment, anchoring, docking & undocking, U.S. Aids to Navigation system, man overboard recovery, emergency radio calls etc. We also had some fun with tying different knots, bowline, stopper knot, clove hitch & fastening to a cleat. While learning sound signals to avoid collisions the instructors had the students play with small boats with whistles - we should have some good pictures including our Rear Commodore and Junior Staff Commodore. There was an exam at the end of the day and all of the participants were awarded the ABC Boating Certificate, which should earn them a discount on their marine insurance.
